Here are a few more things you may want to remember for next week!

- ➤ Long Page Demographic form: Please make any updates to both sides of this page and sign the bottom of the second page! \*\*Please note the photo consent form is an OPT OUT now, not an OPT IN as in previous years. This is a District change!
- Water Bottles: A labelled water bottle is great to pack each day. We encourage students to take them home to be cleaned daily. Bottle filling stations are available in areas of the school.
- Morning Drop Off: If you plan to drop off your child in front of the school, please pull as far ahead as possible in the drop off lane, all the way forward until you can see the orange crosswalk –Just a reminder to drive slowly! Supervision starts when our busses arrive at 7:50 a.m. Please do not drop off your child(ren) before this time. The instructional day begins at 8:10 a.m. and students should be in the classroom ready to go!
- Lunch Time: Please keep in mind as you are planning lunches and snacks for this school year, all ASD-S facilities are Nut FREE. It is very important that we all respect this policy as it is critical to ensuring the health of all our students and staff.
- Afternoon Dismissal/Pick Up: At the end of the day, families who indicated they will pick up their child are asked to be patient as we ensure everyone is going where they need to.

# What's Happening in the Community?


